Mustafa Kemal (Ataturk) stated in 1919 that "[The massacre and deportation of Armenians was the work of a small committee who had seized the power](#)".



Sultan Mehmed VI sentenced the Ottoman leaders who had committed the Armenian genocide to death for crimes against humanity in 1919



Hrant Dink Turkish-Armenian persecuted under [Article 301](#) for discussing the genocide. On 19 January 2007 he was assassinated. In September 2010, the [European Court of Human Rights](#) said Turk authorities had violated Dink's right to life by not preventing murder and by not punishing the police
